During the Sundays in Lent, the preludes and postludes will celebrate the 150th anniversary of the birth of Louis Vierne, the great French organist and composer. Vierne was born blind, though he recovered some sight later with two operations. For 37 years he was organist at Notre Dame cathedral in Paris; he played 1,750 organ recitals and taught at the Schola Cantorum in Paris.
