## **Church Update**

This past week we have witnessed many people expressing their righteous anger about systemic racism and other tools of oppression that continue to divide our nation. The murder of George Floyd calls us to increase our work around racial justice most fervently. While we will never condone violence, at Plymouth Church we continue to work on the side of justice and equity. Many Plymouth members have been among those who demonstrated. Many others have given time and resources toward the clean-up. Others have supplied groceries and food. The church building has functioned as a medical aid and supply station. We are all working to find ways to demand that our city and country live into the ideals that we proclaim: liberty and justice for all.

One way to support the communities affected by the unrest in our city, following the police killing of George Floyd, is to give to the Minneapolis Interfaith Relief Fund (MIRF), established by the senior clergy of the downtown interfaith congregations. An Allocation Team of senior clergy will disburse funds to agencies and partners in communities of color and in the indigenous community that are working directly with those most affected. Westminster Presbyterian is serving as fiscal sponsor for MIRF.
